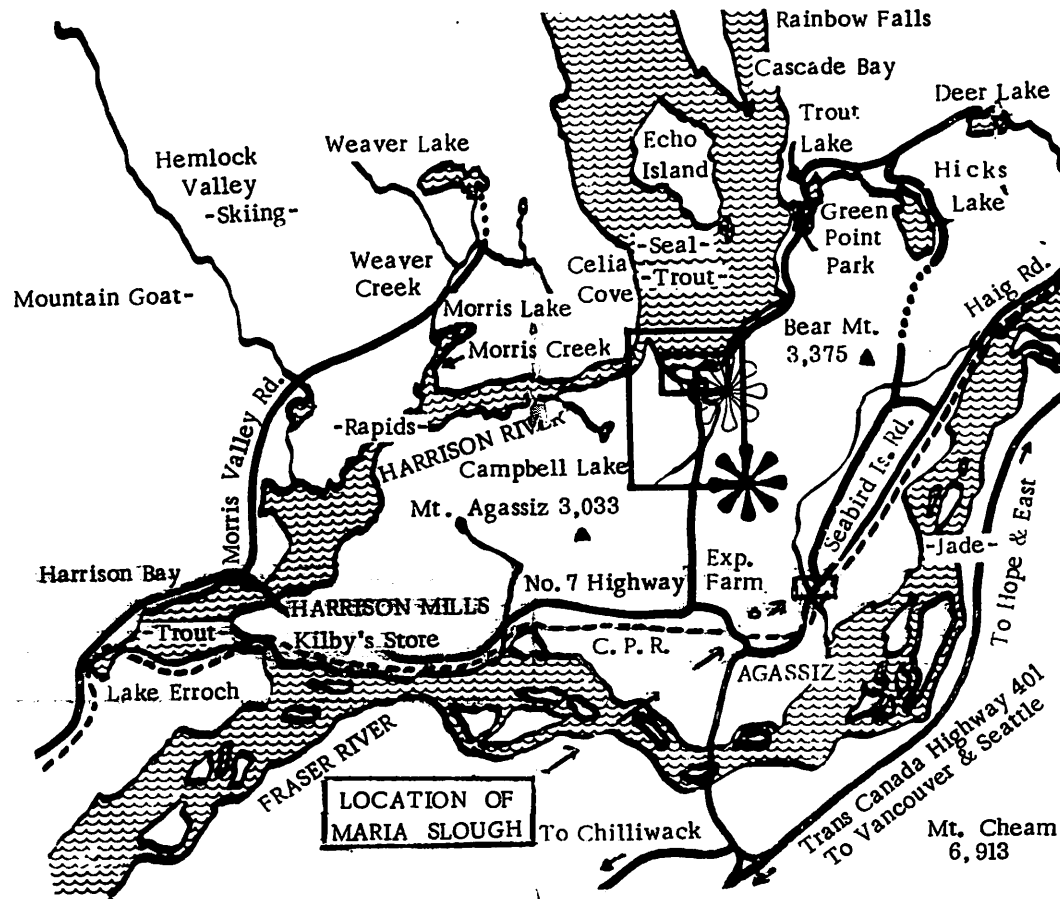

### *Sla Hal Game (Indian Bone Game)*

This is the traditional guessing game used by Indian tribes in all parts of the country. The game is played with two sets of bones. One set is all white while the other is white with a black stripe. The white stands for the female and the black for the male. In a short game seven sticks are used, while in a long game twenty-one are used. The game is played with two teams with one person being the leader or guesser for each side. The object is to get all the sticks. This is done by guessing where the female bone is.

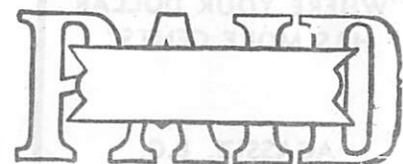
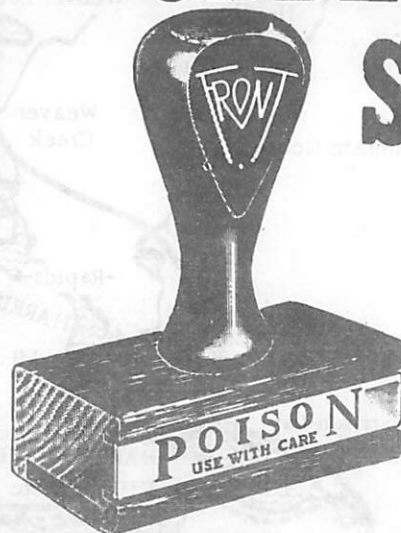

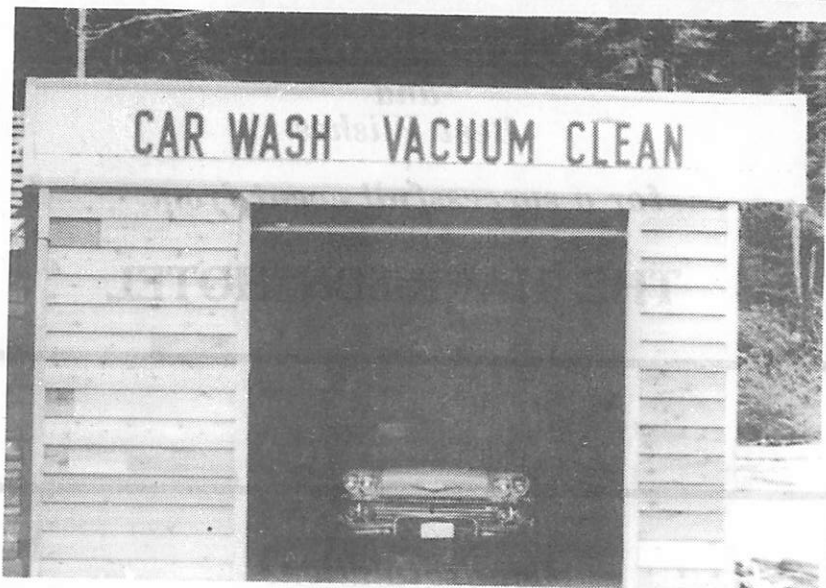

## Maria Slough

At one time these hills echoed with the sound of Paddle Steamers that tied up a half mile down stream from here and exchanged their cargoes for farm produce to be shipped to Yale and other points on the river to Vancouver.

The origins of the name of the Slough are many. However, the one that is most frequently given is that it is named after a daughter of one of the very earliest white settlers on the island.

The first bridge over Maria Slough was built in 1894 and was taken out by the high water of the same year. A second bridge was built in 1896 and this one was used until the existing bridge was built in 1949 as part of the still uncompleted North Shore Highway.

Spring Salmon and Steelhead were planted in the Slough and the Fisheries Department maintained a fish-trap that was used to prevent the coarse fish from moving into the spawning grounds. These spawning grounds are now almost completely depleted.

The earliest record of people to this area notes that the Indians came here about 3,000 years ago. This has recently been confirmed by archaeologists who uncovered Indian artifacts at Katz.

The first road was built around the slough to provide access for farmers who lived in the Walleach area.

Local historians reminisce about the days when ice used to be cut out of the slough and hauled into Agassiz to be used by the Bella Vista Hotel and local residents - also they talk of the many rafts and Huckleberry Finn expeditions that were launched from these banks.

The Indians held War Canoe races here for many years before there was any white settlement with Bands from many parts of the Valley competing.
