





#### REMINISCING

HENRY D. THOMAS: Canoes came from Chilliwack, Chehalis, Laidlaw, and Katz. They only had single, double and six paddle, there was no 11 paddle. The starting line would be at the present bridge and back (2 times) and the finish line was at the present Scott's Meats Abattoir. He said Chehalis always went home as the winners. Also had soccer (football) games and softball games, he said just 1st and 2nd bases were only allowed to use gloves.

BERDIE PETERS: She said just local reserves participated. They would also race on the Fraser River at three different places, at Hope, along Seabird Island and where the ferry that crossed over to Rosedale (under the Rosedale Bridge). All the food was donated.

SYLVESTER JOE SR: He can remember it being the local reserves participating. Starting line was at the present bridge and finish line at the mouth of the Fraser River (twice). They had single, double and six paddle canoes. There was also canoe tipping contests and soccer games. They didn't have any teams. The prizes were blankets, oranges, etc. People from Seabird took the guests home and fed them.

Reminiscing with Sylvester Joe Sr. He recalls JIMMIE CHARLIE: canoes from Chehalis, Katz - two canoes, Harrison, Chilliwack, and Laidlaw. Names of the Canoes were Baby Seabird owned by Jimmy Andrew, Silver Creek - Chehalis, Twin Sisters - Katz, Chilliwack had a green canoe, and Laidlaw. He remembers Silver Creek was the Champs for Years - Six paddle races. They also had Double tipping contests. Harry Joe and Adam Louie from Seabird were the Champs for years. Ed Leon and John Mac from Chehalis were a couple of the the competitors. Single canoes races Jimmie Charlie and Adam Louie - The prizes were a Lunch Can and to this day Jimmie still has the lunch can and Adam Louie came in second and he won a blanket. Prizes for a six paddle races was \$1.50 at this time. They also focused on the Children's Foot Races, other Festivities were Soccer. Horse racing, and Tug of War. For people to get to their destination they all travelled by canoes on the river. Places they would go would be Chehalis, Seabird, Katz, Laidlaw and Chilliwack.






