## WELCOME TO THE GATHERING OF PEOPLE

It is likely that as long as humans have existed, they have sought opportunities to join with others for mutually beneficial purposes: to trade, settle disputes, and create cooperation. It is known that slahal has been a shared activity for millennia, crossing family, community, and language barriers, allowing diverse people to gather in meaningful ways. In the pre-mechanical era, overland trails and the use of waterways meant long journeys for the gathering of Stó:lō families from different settlements.

The Seabird Island Festival is a continuation of the traditional gathering of the Stó:lō people, where different communities connect with old acquaintances, share cultural practices, and engage in healthy competition. Canoeing points to the rich history of the people, while soccer is also a popular form of pitting nation against nation. The greater purpose remains to bring people with a shared background together.

The Seabird Island Festival gathering is intergenerational, inclusive of newborns, children of all ages, and Elders. The festival is a sharing of tradition from the old to the young in all of its fun, competition, and social engagement. Youth learn of self-identity by watching how Elders compete without quitting and by respecting others through fair play. They experience the value of joining with others, sharing similar ceremonies, and being proud of their own communities.

# Sport Code of Conduct



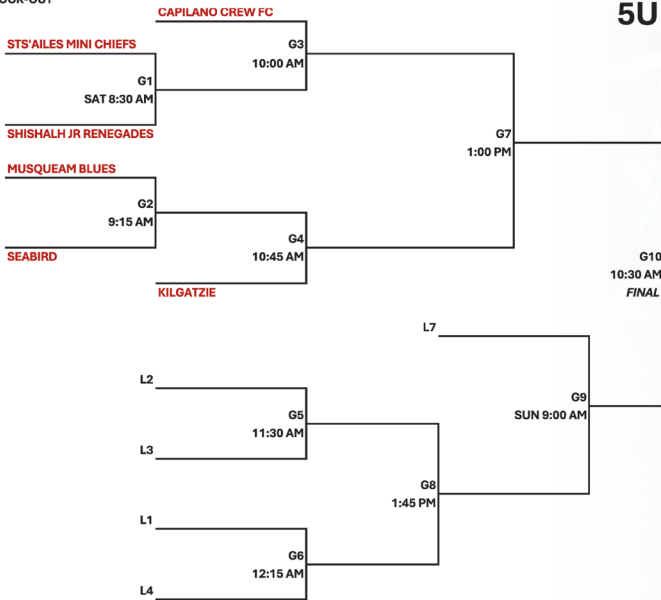
1. Remember, the players are involved in the sport for their enjoyment, not yours.

# CANOE RACES RULES

1. All canoes and skippers must be registered by 10:00 AM, Saturday, May 25, 2024.
2. Races begin at 11:00 AM, Saturday and Sunday.
3. Each race must begin and end with the same number of participants in each canoe. Failure to do so will result in disqualification from that race.
4. Canoe Skippers are required to hold onto the starting rope with all other paddles raised overhead. Failure to have all paddles in the air will result in disqualification for that race.
5. Canoes must complete all turns. Missing a turn will result in being disqualified from the race.
6. Swinging of paddles will result in disqualification from the race.
7. Absolutely no contact is permitted with opponents – this will result in disqualification from the race.
8. There will be zero tolerance for verbal abuse towards officials. Individuals will be disqualified and will not be allowed to participate in the next race.
9. Protests must be submitted by the Canoe Skipper in writing within 30 minutes after the completion of the race.
10. Judges' decisions are final.
11. Prizes will be awarded after each race and should be picked up by the canoe skipper only.
12. All canoes must register and attend both races days to receive travel honorarium.
13. Travel expenses for canoes will be paid on Sunday, May 26, 2024 after the races and must be picked up by only the Canoe Skipper.
14. No paddle restrictions.

# BEHIND THE SCENES AT SEABIRD ISLAND FESTIVAL

May 24 to 26, 2024, will see thousands of men, women, and children visit Seabird Island to enjoy the annual gathering of many communities who share common traditions and culture. The planning committee convened starting in the fall of 2023, examining every part of the operation. Behind the scenes, work on the festival site began many weeks ago with field preparations and the installation of new soccer nets. Contracts for porta-potties, site security, and First Aid have been arranged.

During the festival, over 75 people are involved each day to ensure a positive experience for everyone. The festival draws on community volunteers and staff from all departments for its success. Accountants, parents, high school students, teachers, engineers, and managers help with the tournaments, parking, site services, and program activities. ## Indian Festival at Seabird Island

### HISTORY OF FESTIVALS

*Seabird Festival records go back to 1971. The history of First Nations festivals dates to before colonization. First Nation tribes would travel up and down the river by canoe to other tribes to compete in sports and games, to trade, to look for a spouse, to reconnect with family from other tribes, all while sharing stories and music. Today's festival circuit is much the same. Most do not travel by river to get to the festivals anymore, but we still bring the canoes and use them to compete.*

*For thousands of years, Indigenous peoples have played their own sports to teach survival and other life skills, for fun, and for competition. The First Nations' contributions to Canadian sports are visible today in sports such as kayaking, canoeing, snowshoeing, swimming, wrestling, and lacrosse, a sport which was originally played by First Nations people on the east coast.*

*Soccer is the world's most popular sport and one of the oldest sports known, beginning over 2000 years ago in China. Cuju involved kicking a ball into a small hole. A similar sport was recorded in Mexico and Central America in 1600 A.D. Records show the use of balls stuffed with grass, caribou hair, and moss in Alaska and Canada. In 1620, the natives in the Jamestown settlement (Virginia, USA) played a game called pasuckuakohowog (they gather to play ball with the foot). The rough game was played on the beach, half a mile wide, with the goals a mile apart and as many as 1000 players.*

*We hope everybody continues to join us and share in the rich history and culture celebrated at the Seabird Island First Nation Festival for years to come. We look forward to seeing you all at other events on the circuit this year.*
